

**PROCEEDING OF THE 7<sup>TH</sup> EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING OF DISTRICT  
MINERAL FOUNDATION, SUNDARGARH HELD ON DATE 18.07.2018 AT  
5:30 PM IN THE PRAGATI MANDAP, SUNDARGARH.**

The 7<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting of District Mineral Foundation, Sundargarh was held on 18<sup>th</sup> July' 2018 at 5.30 PM in Pragati Mandap, Sundargarh under the Chairmanship of Shri Surendra Kumar Meena, I.A.S., Collector & Chairman of the Executive Committee, D.M.F., Sundargarh.

The list of Members attended the meeting is as per Annexure-I annexed herewith.

At the outset, the Collector welcomed all the members of the Committee to the 7<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting. He asked the Chief Executive Officer, DMF Sundargarh to brief about the collection of funds from different lessee under DMF, amount allocated to different executing agencies and expenditure thereof and progress of works as on the date.

The Chief Executive Officer, DMF, Sundargarh read out the action points of the last Executive Committee meeting held on 21<sup>st</sup> February' 2018 which was sent to all Members for compliance and confirmed by the Members. He intimated that a total of Rs.933.27 Crores has been received, against which Rs. 154.74 Crores has been expenditure out of total project sanctioned cost of Rs.795.29 Crores.

Collector intimated the Committee that in between the 6<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting held on 21.02.2018 to till date, 252 nos. of projects have been sanctioned under DMF, the details of which project-wise was discussed in the meeting and the Committee unanimously approved all these 252 projects, subject to post-facto approval in the next Board of Trustee Meeting. He further emphasized that the following 03 major projects have also been sanctioned under DMF as per huge demand of the public as well as observation of State Nodal Secretaries during their visit to the district, which was also discussed and approved by the Committee after a threadbare discussion, subject to place in the next Board of Trustee Meeting for post-facto approval.

- (1) Construction of High Level bridge over River IB at 1<sup>st</sup> Km on Sundargarh–Rajpur Road.
- (2) Construction of mini-stadium at Bihabandh under Rajgangpur Block
- (3) Engagement of 10 nos. of Mobile Medical Vans in the district.

Collector stated that registration of the DMF Trust has not yet done, due to which proportionate tax is being deducted from the amount accrued as interest against the money deposited. Asked the CEO, DMF to take immediate necessary steps for registration of the Trust, so that Income tax return can be filed before 31<sup>st</sup> July 2018 to get back the deducted tax amount of previous years.

The P.D., DRDA asked to submit the list of all major Panchayat Samiti roads in Hemgir and Koida blocks to the EE, RWD, Sundargarh and Rourkela respectively to take up all such road projects for improvement. After improvement of the roads in Hemgir and Koida blocks, the roads of other four mining blocks, such as, Kutra, Rajgangpur, Kaurmunda and Lahunipada are to be taken up in phased manner by the concerned EE, RW Divisions.

It has been decided to provide hostel buildings in all the OAV schools in mining affected areas of the district. But, the plan & design of hostels should be prepared for 200 boarders separately for both the boys and girls to save the space, instead 02 nos. of 100 seated hostels.



Collector stated that due to mining operations and movement of heavy and multi-axle vehicles carrying minerals, the roads are being damaged and creating air and dust pollution. DDM, Koida to fix one 'Air Quality Display Board' in Koida Bus stand for the information of public and to control air pollution in the areas. Further, it was also emphasized for construction of two nos. of Check Posts by DDM, Koirā, one at Barsuan-Kaleiposh road and another at Jamudihi road with CCTV cameras to check whether the vehicles carrying minerals are covered with tarpaulin, which should be ensured by the DDM, Koirā.

Collector expressed his displeasure on the expenditure under DMF which is very less and asked to issue instructions to the Executing Agencies to expedite the progress to increase the expenditure under all sector. The list of major projects which are pending at EIC/SE level for tendering process should be submitted by the concerned Executing Agencies to the Collector for follow up action at proper level.

Collector further stated that no extension of time shall be given to contractors for completion of the project and accordingly the Executing Agencies should be asked to intimate the contractor for timely completion of the projects. In special cases, time extension may be allowed subject to valid and strong reason. Penalty should be imposed against the Contractors, who are not completing their projects in time from Running Bills.

Collector apprised the members that the payments against uploading of bills in DMF Portal by the Executing Agencies are being done within 3 days to the Bank Accounts of the concerned Executing Agencies and accordingly, they should also ensure to release the entitled amount within 7 days to the Contractors/ Suppliers/ Agencies. It was also instructed to furnish the copy of Gramsabha Resolution/ Proceeding reflecting approval of the project in question against during submission of the estimate.

The project proposal in municipalities having project cost of less than Rs.20.00 lakh shall not be taken up under DMF, and the same shall be adjusted against their departmental schemes.

Collector asked the EE, RWSS, Sundargarh and Rourkela to submit proposals for sinking of tube wells only in the habitations where tube wells are not available. Similarly, the proposal for installation of solar based dual pumps in the uncovered villages should be submitted where no piped water supply system is available or feasible. In the cases of Piped Water supply projects, the EEs must ensure sustainability of source for at least 20 years.


It was also emphasized that skill development for livelihood support and income generation is still a grey sector in DMF and accordingly priority should be given to take up such projects relating to Agricultural Livelihood, Forest Livelihood etc. in the mining affected areas of the district. It was also suggested to integrate the livelihood projects with OLM in consultation with DFO, which will generate income to the unemployed people, will be benefited directly to them.

The construction of Anganwadi buildings in mining affected areas have been entrusted to RWD, Sundargarh & Rourkela, PA, ITDAs and concerned BDOs under DMF. The EE, RWD, Sundargarh and Rourkela shows inability to take up AWC building due to heavy work load and shortage of technical manpower. Accordingly, it was decided to withdraw all such AWC projects allotted to them and allotted among the Blocks and ITDA concerned equally to complete the works at the earliest.

Collector asked the Members and to issue instructions to all the Executing Agencies to give focus on taking up projects in the areas which are affected due to direct mining operations in saturation mode.

After broad discussion on the above proposals/points, the Committee unanimously approved the same. For the interest of the people of mining affected area, it was decided that additional projects after this meeting shall be administratively approved by the Collector and post-facto approval of which shall be obtained in the next Executive Committee Meeting.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair & Participants.
