

**PROCEEDING OF THE 8<sup>TH</sup> EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING OF DISTRICT  
MINERAL FOUNDATION, SUNDARGARH HELD ON 27.11.2018 AT  
10:30 AM IN THE RESIDENCE OFFICE OF COLLECTOR, SUNDARGARH.**

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The 8<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting of District Mineral Foundation, Sundargarh was held on 27<sup>th</sup> November' 2018 at 10:30 AM in the Residence Office of Collector, Sundargarh under the Chairmanship of Shri Surendra Kumar Meena, I.A.S., Collector & Chairman of the Executive Committee, D.M.F., Sundargarh.

The list of Members attended the meeting is attached to this proceeding at **Annexure-I.**

At the outset, the Collector welcomed all the members of the Committee to the 8<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting of DMF, Sundargarh. He asked the Chief Executive Officer, DMF, Sundargarh to brief about the collection of DMF funds, Administratively Approved amount of sanctioned projects and total expenditure thereof.

The Chief Executive Officer, DMF, Sundargarh briefed on the Action Points of the proceedings of last Executive Committee meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> July' 2018. He intimated that a total sum of Rs.1117.23 Crores has been received, against which Rs.221.00 Crores has been expenditure against sanctioned project cost of Rs.1504.17 Crores involving 4,426 nos. of projects as per demand of the public.

Collector apprised the Committee Members that in between the 7<sup>th</sup> Executive Committee Meeting held on 18.07.2018 to till date, 703 nos. of projects amounting to Rs.654.26 Cr have been sanctioned under DMF, the details of which project wise was discussed and the Committee unanimously approved all such projects as at Annexure-II, the post-facto approval of which should be obtained in the next Board of Trustee meeting.

1. Construction of new road to Koida town by passing the Barsuan – Tensa – Kaleiposh–Koida hilly terrain road. Executive Engineer, Roads and Building, Rourkela has instructed to submit the Estimate for according administrative approval
2. Improvement of Road to Ushakothi (7 kms) in Lephripada Block to be taken under DMF for the FY 2018-19, Executive Engineer, Rural Works Department has instructed to submit the Estimate for according administrative approval.
3. Proving Virtual Class Rooms in 70 Schools in the district and one Studio in the district head quarter for improving the academic standards of the Students
4. Supply of 2550 nos. LPG gas distribution in Aanganwadi centre of the Sundargarh District .
5. Construction of HL bridge over Koel river at Jamunanaki bridge amounting Rs 34.00 Cr to be taken in DMF Sundargarh.

Collector stated that due to mining operations and movement of vehicles carrying minerals, the roads are damaged and air and dust pollution is created. He instructed the DDM, Koida to fix one 'Air Quality Display Board' in Koida Bus stand area to monitor the pollution level and to install CCTV cameras in check posts (Barsuan-Kaleiposh road and Jamudihi road) for ensuring that the mineral carrying vehicles are covered with tarpaulin. The tender process for the same should be carried out at district level (DMF Cell) for selection of agency on EPC mode with operation and maintenance of the above for a period of 5 years.

Collector addressed his concern that expenditure of the DMF till date is very less, for which all the approved projects needs to be expedited. He stated that although a numbers of projects have been sanctioned since long under DMF, but the Executing Agencies have not yet submitted the estimates for Administrative Approval. Further, the Executive Engineer, RW Division, Sundargarh and Rourkela were requested to submit project proposals relating to the unconnected villages for Rajgangpur, Kutra and Kuarmunda blocks at the earliest. During submission of estimates, it should be ensured to include the pre-execution activity cost in the estimate, as decided in the meeting.

Collector informed to all the Committee members that skill development for livelihood support and income generation is still a grey sector in DMF and such projects related to Agricultural & Forest Livelihood should be looked in the mining areas of the district. Collector stated to integrate the livelihood projects with OLM and discuss with DFO for taking all such projects which will generate income to the unemployed people and which will be benefited directly to them. He further instructed to all the executive members to look for all other possible aspects of livelihood and community development for enhancement of income in both rural and urban areas.

Demand was raised by the PRI Members during holding of meetings at Hemgir, Bonai and Nuagaon blocks that some of the GPs like Kanika and Duduka of Hemgir block, Kendrikela, Kenaveta, Kasada, Jhirdapali, Bonaigarh of Bonai Block and Ankurpali, Jahaditoli and Purunapani of Nuagaon block are directly/indirectly and adversely affected by the mining operations and transportation of mineral in those areas. Accordingly, it was decided to include all such Gram Panchayats under the Mining Affected GP list for development under DMF, which should also be placed before the next Board of Trustee Meeting for final approval.

For the interest of the mining affected people, it was decided that additional projects after this meeting may also be administratively approved by the Collector and post-facto approval of which shall be obtained in the next Executive Committee Meeting as well as Board of Trustee Meeting.

The meeting ended with vote of thanks to the Chair & Participants.
